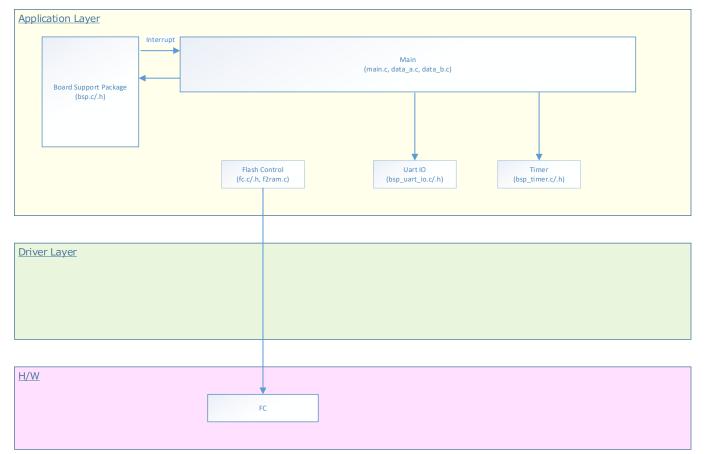

## 6. Sample Program: Flash\_Userboot

This sample software programs data A and data B alternately to a special region of Flash memory using Flash memory function.

#### 6.1. Outlines of Operation

Data table A and B with different display contents are placed in the Flash memory. After reset, the main program starts up and output the display pattern in the data table (data A). BSP\_LED\_0 and BSP\_LED\_2 flashes case of data A.

When BSP\_PSW\_3 is pushed down, the data A and B are transferred to the RAM.

The areas of the data A and B in the Flash memory are erased.

The data B in the RAM is programmed to Flash memory of data A, and The data A in the RAM is programmed to Flash memory of data B.

By output the display pattern in the data table (data B) from main program, you can confirm that the Flash memory have been rewritten.

BSP\_LED\_1 and BSP\_LED\_3 flashes case of data B.

If BSP\_PSW\_3 is pushed down again, the same operation is done, and rewrite alternately the data A and the data B.

The status of the main program is displayed on the terminal emulator.
